Description

Pauline Maier shows us the Declaration as both the defining statement of our national identity and the moral standard by which we live as a nation. It is truly "American Scripture," and Maier tells us how it came to be -- from the Declaration's birth in the hard and tortuous struggle by which Americans arrived at Independence to the ways in which, in the nineteenth century, the document itself became sanctified.

Maier describes the transformation of the Second Continental Congress into a national government, unlike anything that preceded or followed it, and with more authority than the colonists would ever have conceded to the British Parliament; the great difficulty in making the decision for Independence; the influence of Paine's *Common Sense*, which shifted the terms of debate; and the political maneuvers that allowed Congress to make the momentous decision.

In Maier's hands, the Declaration of Independence is brought close to us. She lets us hear the voice of the people as revealed in the other "declarations" of 1776: the local resolutions -- most of which have gone unnoticed over the past two centuries -- that explained, advocated, and justified Independence and undergirded Congress's work. Detective-like, she discloses the origins of key ideas and phrases in the Declaration and unravels the complex story of its drafting and of the group-editing job which angered Thomas Jefferson.

Maier also reveals what happened to the Declaration after the signing and celebration: how it was largely forgotten and then revived to buttress political arguments of the nineteenth century; and, most important, how Abraham Lincoln ensured its persistence as a living force in American society. Finally, she shows how by the very act of venerating the Declaration as we do -- by holding it as sacrosanct, akin to holy writ -- we may actually be betraying its purpose and its power.

Erin: A really great look at the lead up to and actual creation of the Declaration of Independence, as well as Americans' treatment of the Declaration in the century after the Revolution. Wonderfully written for a lay audience, though the section on the actual writing of the Declaration gets a bit tedious. Only gave it four stars because I was hoping it would be more about Americans' memory of the Declaration than the Declaration itself. Still, I would recommend this book to anyone interested in learning about the Declaration as those who wrote it would have thought about it.

What I found disappointing was the fact that the Declaration of Independence was rather forgotten and neglected for a century and a half. I'm quite saddened by this fact, on top of the fact that today's generation have not learned about the documents that created the foundation of the United States of America.

To sum up, in accordance with Maier, colonists grew to become to revolution merely whilst the King declared them out of his protection, now not through the arguments of republican ideology; kingdom governments had first made their declarations which made more desirable instances opposed to the king than had Jefferson's; and Jefferson was once the drafter, now not writer of the announcement of Independence, who may be to blame of plagiarism. whereas i don't believe Maier's attempt to minimize the Declaration's ancient significance (she may say "mythological status"), the quantity of knowledge given during this part is worthy a learn and doubtless 4 stars. however the final 30 pages of the book, however, are dedicated to the Declaration's lasting impact and harps at the contradiction of a slave-holding country founding at the trust that every one males are created equal. rather than arguing that the recognition of slavery used to be an important evil to maintain the federal union intact, Maier argues that the assertion is a "living document" that completed its precise promise via Lincoln's new use of it within the Gettysburg Address. She concludes through pointing out that the Declaration's
