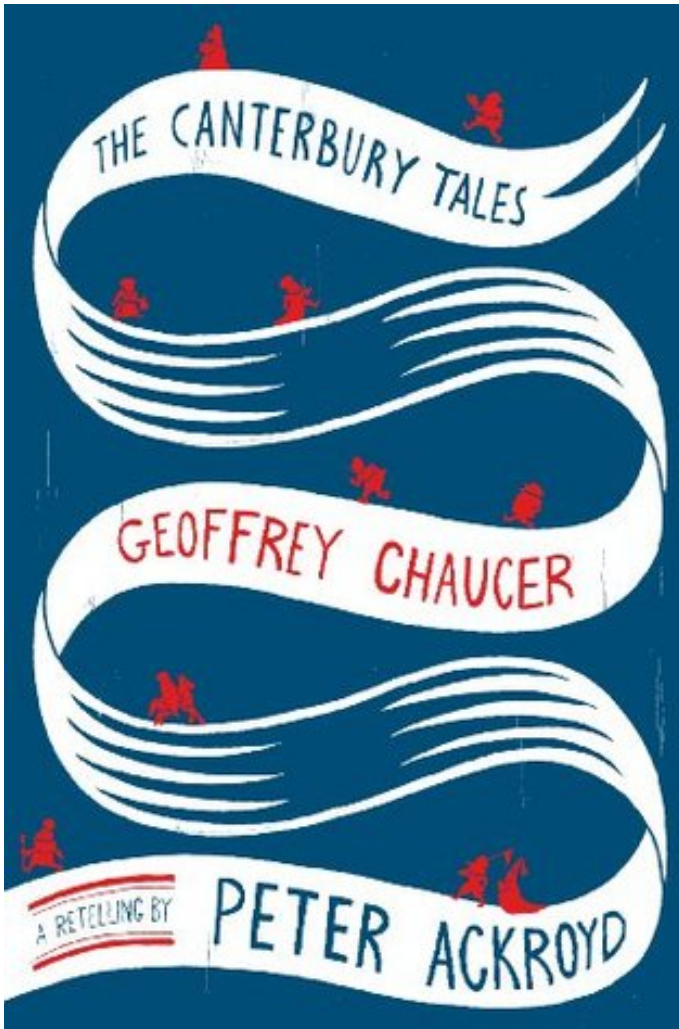

Julie Davis: After days of careful consideration, listening to audio samples, and having too many choices in my new Audible subscription ... I decided to throw caution to the winds and try something completely different from my usual fare.

I've always wanted to tackle *The Canterbury Tales* but never felt brave enough. It was a conversation this morning that turned the tide. Our priest said that, although he had a great affection for Dante's *Divine Comedy*, it was *The Canterbury Tales* that he found most helpful on the journey.

'Nuff said.

Now my journey begins under Geoffrey Chaucer's guidance, with Peter Ackroyd's assistance. Fingers crossed I don't hit too many potholes!

A.: I haven't looked at the *Canterbury Tales* since college. I remembered the bawdy Wife of Bath's tale but little else. Acroyd's prose translation is quite entertaining. It seems that he keeps to the spirit of Chaucer's work even though we lose the poetry. The tales get repetitive with many stories of Greek and Roman heroes and actually very few set in contemporary time. On rereading the Wife of Bath tale, what made it stand out wasn't the sexual content, but that it is

set in Chaucer's time and involves ordinary people rather than heroic knights or people speaking directly to Greek Gods.

I didn't realize that the joke "She's no lady, she's my wife," went back to Chaucer's time. It's referred to as an old joke in the stories. We also get a variation of "take my wife, please." Most of the banter between the characters on the pilgrimage occurs in the prologues of the stories and reveals more about life in England than the stories themselves.

I might have to look up the Decameron next.

Tony Laplume: I studied this in high school and college, so returning to *Canterbury* once again is a...revelation, actually. Strangely enough, I recognize Chaucer a lot more from a class I took on Middle English literature (in which we read the original Middle English) and other work he did. *Canterbury* itself emerges as something of a parody of what literature must have been like in Chaucer's day, the themes obsessively returned to (another reason for people *today* to quit saying there's no new stories anymore when a remake or a sequel comes up once again at the movies), and how he skewers not only the storytelling but the people telling the stories, which is the true genius of the work. Today it's remembered for helping validate English as a language and being itself a notable early work of English literature, but in Ackroyd's retelling *Canterbury* is once again as lively a work as you will ever find. When Chaucer himself shows up to tell a nonsense story in rhyme, there's even the sense that this is the predecessor to Monty Python. A little while back I tried reading Boccaccio's *Decameron*, which is *similar* but not at all the same. There's a reason teachers like assigning *Canterbury*, and why it's been worth returning to for six hundred years...
