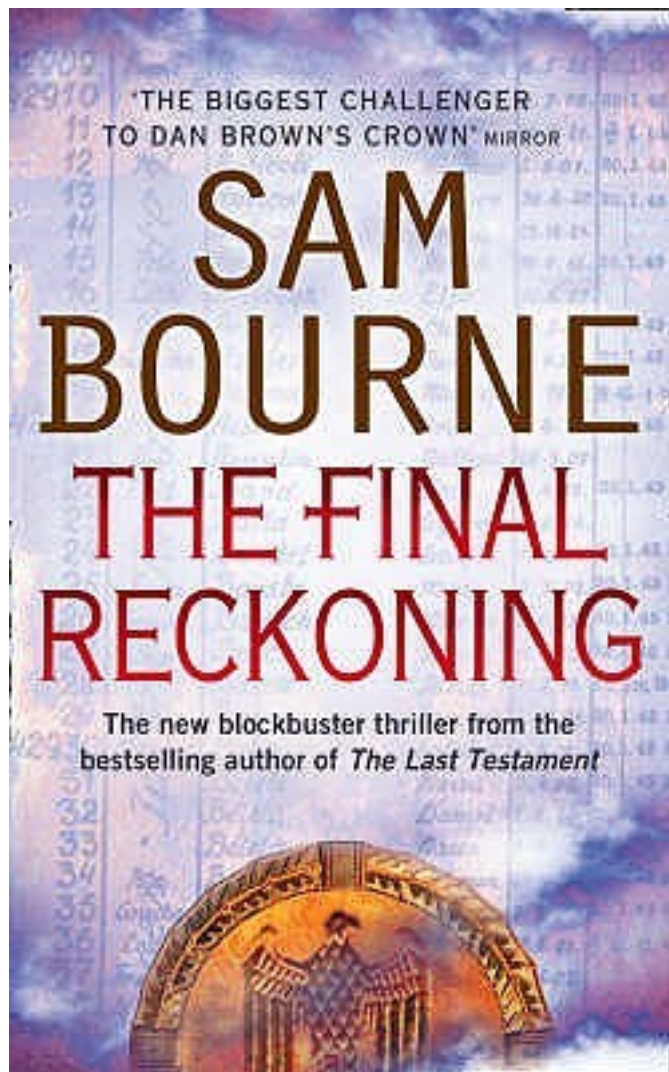

Kelly Hager: This is fiction but is based on true events. After the Holocaust (years later), a group of Jews began tracking down and killing Nazis. This is a novel about that.

That's all I want to tell you about the plot of this book, because it's so amazing and exciting that I don't want to cheat you out of anything.

If you like thrillers or World War II or books that are well-written and exciting, this is the novel for you. (And out in plenty of time for winter holiday presents! Except for Hanukkah, which begins tomorrow.)

In college, I took a course on the Holocaust my freshman year and I've been to the museum in DC (although I don't count that, really, because if there's one thing you shouldn't do right after your dad dies of cancer, it's visit a museum dedicated to the Holocaust), so I thought I knew a lot about the Holocaust. After reading this book, I realize I don't know anything. I don't mean to discourage you from reading it--Final Reckoning discusses the events of the Holocaust and there are times I cried but really, considering what this book is about, it's so much easier to read than it could be.

This is an important book because it discusses a hideous time in our past, obviously, but also because it raises very thorny moral issues and questions. Is it wrong to kill Nazis who have escaped justice for what they've done? And if you agree that it's right to do so, how far down the line do you go? The people who give the orders are obviously responsible, but how many others?

I loved this book, even though it isn't the easiest book to enjoy. It's so worth it, though, and I highly recommend it.

Plot and pace - The first 100 and last 100 pages of the novel were utterly brilliant; my heart was simply racing as I read through the tale of a dog-cat-mouse chase that leads to a question of whodunnit. It straight away went in with the murder of the suspected 'terrorist', Gershon Matzkin at the UN Embassy in New York. Tom, the lawyer employed by the UN, straight away gets to work investigating. Of course it's not clear cut, it wouldn't be much of a murder mystery novel if it was. An ex-Holocaust survivor, vigilante of the Jewish resistance out of retirement for one more

assassination; that much was obvious early on. The question was who was he after? My early guess was some leader of some organisation or country.

Another confusion added to the mix; who was trying to stop Tom and the grieving daughter Rebecca from finding all this out and progressing with their detective work? Well, it's the Middle-East, a connection in which I am unsure was entirely valid; it was quite weak having them as the middle man. When it is revealed why they were concerned and involved, it seems altogether pointless. I'd much rather it was the UN stalking them and it would have made a lot more sense.

As I said earlier, the start and ending were great. The middle was bogged down with what seemed like a thesis on the Holocaust and Jewish resistance/anti-Nazi movement; most of which was covered by GCSE Modern History. I guess I may have shown some more interest if perhaps it was a war in which I knew nothing about, in some 'hidden country'. But alas, as I fear with all novels concerning WWII, it turns into a history lesson full of facts and not really emotive as the author intended. I know it needs to be included for back-ground to the character but do you really need 300 pages full of it.

Still as we near the finishing line it turns out my first guess was close but I was not expecting the two big twists. I shall not reveal them so as to not completely ruin it for readers. But I genuinely was surprised. What a relief I was satisfied with the ending!!

Characters - The plot really did distract from the characters. So much so I completely misread one of the main characters as was evident in the final chapters, when I was totally shocked at the revelation they gave. The character you find the most about is actually the one that is killed at the start of the novel. It's through Gershon's journal entries that you reveal more about his character and become involved and in some instance believe in his reasons for joining the resistance. The two leads, Tom and Rebecca are nice enough. Good guys with a dark side, not irritating, good at what they do - what you want from the lead really, though they did lack the dark humour aspect.

Language and dialogue used - Very easy reading. Not at all difficult. The plot is clever enough. I really enjoyed the Yiddish language used in the book. It's not often authors use such a language so extensively and it not only shows that Sam Bourne did his homework, but also that he has a great appreciation and respect for other cultures.

Settings - Part in London, part in New York and in Gershon's journal mainly eastern Europe. What I enjoyed most was the setting in the UN Embassy and how it lies out of national jurisdiction. Even in New York, the moment you step in the UN territory you are, by law standards out of America. How cool is that!

Themes and ideas - It is a well-thought out plot that draws together and mixes events in WWII and really displays how they are interconnected throughout the world and how they can still be relevant today.

The Verdict - I can see why the Daily Mirror compared him to Dan Brown. This novel has the same intelligent writing and gripping twists in the novels. However, he also has the weakness of

Dan Brown; it is, at times like digesting a historical textbook. That said, his story is enthralling and powerful and the ending is absolutely superb and satisfying which altogether means this novel stands as a great whodunnit. Sam Bourne, I remain a huge fan of yours. 4\* Stars.

David Gee: A cop shoots an elderly man in the United Nations Plaza in New York, mistaking him for a terrorist. Lawyer Tom Byrne investigates the shooting and finds that the dead man, a naturalized Briton but originally a Jew from Lithuania, may not have been an innocent victim. Working alongside the Lithuanian's glamorous daughter (cue romance!), Byrne is soon on the trail of a 'cabal' that has been exacting revenge for the Holocaust since the late 1940s.

Sam Bourne is often trumpeted as one of Dan Brown's biggest rivals, but I found myself getting echoes of Robert Ludlum, the 'grand-daddy' of the modern conspiracy thriller. Bourne is a better writer than Brown but not quite in Ludlum's league. THE FINAL RECKONING has an intriguing opening and a thrilling climax back in New York, but the central section in London sags with too much talk and not enough action (a common flaw in this genre). You want something involving Nazi-hunters to be quirky like THE BOYS FROM BRAZIL or to have the breathtaking pace of Spielberg's Indiana Jones movies.
