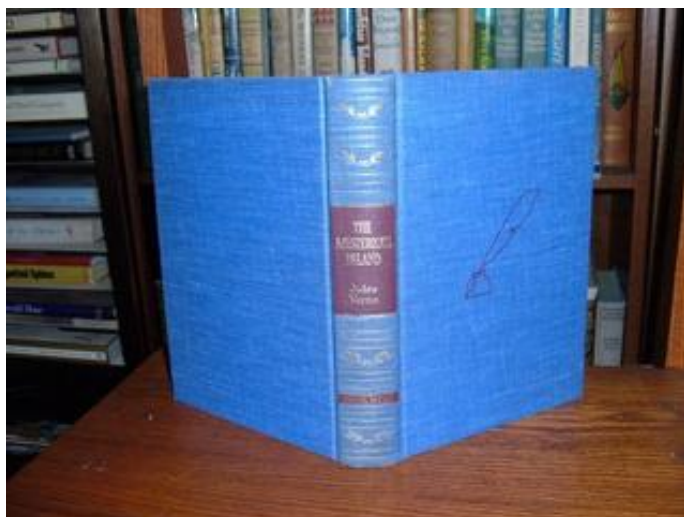

Description

The book describes adventures on an uncharted S. Pacific island. It begins during the siege of Richmond, CSA capital. As famine & death ravage the city, five US prisoners of war escape by hijacking a balloon. They are Cyrus Smith, GAR railroad engineer, his Afro-American butler Nebuchadnezzar, the sailor Bonadventure Pencroff & his protégé Herbert Brown, an orphan raised by Pencroff & journalist Gideon Spilett. The company includes Cyrus' dog 'Top'.

After flying in stormy weather for days, they crash on a cliff-bound, volcanic island, located about 2,500 km east of New Zealand. They name it "Lincoln Island" after their president. With Smith's knowledge they're able to produce pottery, bricks, nitroglycerin, iron, a telegraph, a "Granite House" & a ship. They also manage to find their geographical location. They overcome bad weather & eventually domesticate an orangutan, Jupiter.

The island's mystery stems from periodic, inexplicable *dei ex machina*: the unexplainable survival of Smith from a fall, the mysterious rescue of Top from a dugong, a box full of useful equipment, the finding of a message in the sea calling for help etc.

Finding a message in a bottle, they use their small ship to explore nearby Tabor Island, where a castaway is supposedly sheltered. They go & find Ayrton (from *In Search of the Castaways*), living like a wild beast, & bring him back to Lincoln Island. Enroute they're confused by a tempest, but find their way thanks to a fire beacon; which no one seems to have lit.

Ayrton's former crew of pirates arrives at Lincoln Island to use it as a hideout. After fighting the heroes, the pirate ship is mysteriously destroyed by an explosion. The pirates are found dead without visible wounds.

Six of the pirates survived & injure Herbert thru a gunshot. Recovering, he contracts malaria & is saved by quinine sulphate, which mysteriously appeared on a table in the Granite House.

The secret of the island is revealed when it turns out to be Captain Nemo's hideout, the harbor of the Nautilus.

Having escaped the Maelstrom at *Twenty Thousand Leagues Under the Sea's* end, the Nautilus sailed until all its crew except Nemo died. Presumably the others perished from natural causes. Now an old bearded man, Nemo returned the Nautilus to one of its ports: the one hollowed out under Lincoln Island.

Nemo had been their savior. He had provided them with equipment, sent the message about Ayrton, mined the pirate ship & killed the pirates with an electric gun. He dies of age. The Nautilus is scuttled to be his tomb.

The island explodes in a volcanic eruption. Joop plunges down a crack in the ground. The castaways, warned by Nemo, find themselves at sea on the last remaining boulder of the island above sea level. They are rescued by the Duncan ship, come to pick up Ayrton, & itself informed by a message left on Tabor Island by Nemo.

I thought that Jules Verne was the greatest dude to have ever drawn breath. I quickly started a campaign to convince others how great this book was. My attempts to sway others was to no avail... no one else was interested.

I think this book was a Christmas present. Heck, I may have just seen the cover and thought the picture was cool. (My copy of the book has an island and a hot air ballon on it). I really don't remember how I came to own it but I am glad that I found it.

Funny sidenote: I once had a girlfriend and we had the crazy notion of reading the others favorite book of all time. I ended up struggling through The Hobbit (out of love of course) and she started but just couldn't make it through Mysterious Island.

Nils Jeppe: do not get me wrong, I cherished The Mysterious Island. However, it objectively didn't age well. First of all, it used to be one among Verne's "educational" novels, and that indicates with plenty and many exposition that does not upload something to the particular tale - and masses of it is not even appropriate anymore (the theories for the formation of continents, or the character of the moon are past dated). The moment challenge is that the tale is simply choke choked with "coincidences", which don't even all make feel if you happen to give some thought to the reason on the end. there's fairly no plot apart from the characters' growth in making the island extra habitable, and acknowledged "coincidences" and the titular mystery. to

fashionable sensibilities, this is often simply not more than enough for an excessive rating. Also as importantly, there's pretty well no personality progress or development either. There are a number of extra minor problems, resembling the "revelation" on the finish itself, yet let's no longer nitpick too much. If you could forget about those issues, and/or simply are looking to learn the vintage for its personal sake, you will do fine. The Mysterious Island additionally works acceptably as a "shipwreck" story. It's nonetheless invaluable reading, yet it is not spectacular.

He may perhaps say nothing, for, within the backside of his center he shared the boldness which his partners had in Cyrus Harding. The engineer used to be to them a microcosm, a compound of each science, a possessor of all human knowledge. This places Harding because the typical leader, simply because he wishes no one, whereas the others desire him. he's the kind of guy different males degree themselves against. so long as he's round they can't falter. And we, the readers, desire

him too, simply because he's the person who consists of the plot forward. he's particularly an excellent personality to have round – he solves all of your problems. It does notwithstanding suggest only a few of those characters felt genuine to me, their consistent goodness and ethical worthiness intended they lacked depth.
